BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Dr. Sarah B. Pomeroy is a social historian who is best known for her work on women in classical antiquity. She was born on March 13, 1938, in New York City. She received her B.A. from Barnard College in 1957; she attended graduate school at Columbia University, where she earned an M.A. in 1959 and Ph.D. in 1961. From 1962-1963, she studied Roman law at the Columbia University Law School. Her first academic appointment was at the University of Texas at Austin from 1961-1962. She began her career at Hunter College as a Lecturer in Classics from 1964-1965, followed by a post at Brooklyn College from 1967-1968, also as a Lecturer in Classics. In 1968, back at Hunter College, she taught the very first class on women in antiquity and she was promoted to Associate Professor; in addition, in 1978, she joined the Graduate School and University Center of the City University of New York as a faculty member in Classics and later was also appointed to the Program in History. Other courses that she has taught through the years include Advanced Latin and Greek; Greek and Roman Literature in Translation; Mythology; and Women and Slaves in Classical Antiquity, among others. She has held visiting professor positions at Columbia University and Vassar College, where she was a Distinguished Visiting Research Professor of Classics. In 1996, she was named a Distinguished Professor of Hunter College, and in 2003, she was awarded the title of Professor Emerita of Classics and History of Hunter College and The Graduate Center.

Professor Pomeroy is the author or editor of twelve books and has published over thirty scholarly articles. Several of her works have been translated into Spanish, Italian, and German. Her first book, *Goddesses, Whores, Wives, and Slaves: Women in Classical Antiquity* was initially published in 1975 and reissued in 1994. Her most recent title is *Pythagorean Women: Their History and Writings* (2013). She has presented papers at numerous conferences and seminars, and she is a member of major professional associations, including the American Philological Association (now called the Society for Classical Studies), the American Philosophical Society, and the Women's Classical Caucus, the latter of which she is a founding member. She also served as an associate editor of the *Journal of Women's History*, and she was on the board of advisors for *Women & History* and the *American Journal of Philology*.

Pomeroy has received grants and awards from the American Council of Learned Societies, the Ford Foundation, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Mellon Foundation, the Guggenheim Foundation, and the American Numismatic Society, among others. She received the City University President's Award for Excellence in Scholarship in 1995.

This collection is a valuable resource for scholars in women's studies, women in classical antiquity, and social history. Sarah Pomeroy's research and writings in these areas and her many contributions to the field of Classics provide a rich trove of materials for others working in these disciplines.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection mostly consists of the professional papers of Sarah B. Pomeroy, which relate to her career as a professor, writer, editor, and scholar of Classics, History, and Women's Studies. The majority of the items are paper documents, but there are some photographs, CDs, and diskettes of images for various publications. The bulk of the material is from the 1960s-2000s, and it is arranged chronologically within each folder beginning with the earliest date. Material from Pomeroy's teaching career includes such items as notes and reading material for lectures; syllabi; midterms and exams; and correspondence with institutions and colleagues. Items related to her publications include copies of published articles, books, and reviews (all books are located in Special Collections); research on various topics (most of which consists of photocopied scholarly articles and book excerpts); correspondence with publishers, editors, and assistants; reviews of her work; and citations to her work. Additional materials consist of awards; correspondence with professional associations, conference participants, and grant-funding institutions; drafts and copies of conference papers and visiting lectures; grant and fellowship award-related items; and posters, flyers, and advertisements for publications and lectures. There are a few personal items in the collection, mostly artwork, exhibition catalogs, and correspondence.

This series mostly contains biographical material about Sarah B. Pomeroy; subseries one focuses on her education, from her early years through graduate school. Subseries three includes travel documentation for personal trips and subseries four consists of preferred news clippings, postcards, exhibition catalogues, and artwork presumably used to decorate her office and/or home.

SERIES III – TEACHING CAREER, 1960s-2003

Scope and Content Note

This series contains material related to Sarah B. Pomeroy's teaching career at various institutions. Subseries one consists of items associated with her tenure at the City University of New York, which includes Hunter College and The Graduate Center. These items include teaching materials, such as syllabi; notes for lectures; research material and reading assignments; blank quizzes and exams; student evaluations; and attendance lists. In addition, there is administrative material, such as correspondence with Hunter College and The Graduate Center; correspondence with colleagues; teaching schedules; grievances; college newsletters and brochures; documentation of committee participation, including theses committees; and recommendations for students and colleagues. Subseries two encompasses National Endowment for the Humanities-sponsored seminars taught by Pomeroy to classics and history students, scholars, and historians on different topics, during the summers in the 1980s. The material includes NEH application materials; correspondence with the NEH and seminar participants; budgets; notes; and research materials. Subseries three, "Women in Antiquity", encompasses the various courses taught by Pomeroy over the years on women in classical antiquity; this material includes the first-ever series of lectures on the topic, as well as exams, assignments, course descriptions, lecture notes, visual aids, and research material.

SERIES IV – PUBLICATIONS, 1960-2015

Scope and Content Note

This series encompasses two main topics, publications and research. Publications include scholarly articles, books, and book reviews; research refers to mostly photocopied scholarly articles and book excerpts by other authors, used by Pomeroy for her own publications, lectures, and papers. Subseries one, on scholarly articles, contains drafts and copies of the articles; notes; correspondence with publishers; and images. Subseries two consists of material for her published books, such as correspondence with publishers, drafts, notes from editors, images, permissions, and royalty statements, plus copies of the books themselves (all located in Special Collections). Subseries three, on citations, concerns other publications that cite or quote Pomeroy as a resource. Subseries four relates to research conducted for publications and teaching; it includes handwritten and typed notes; mostly photocopied articles; photocopies of book pages and chapters; some correspondence with colleagues requesting recommendations or reading of their drafts; and drafts for articles. Some of the research was most likely utilized for teaching as well, so there is some overl ap with series III. The final subseries, reviews, comprises reviews of Pomeroy's publications and reviews written by her.
