6 Looking for a quiet place to study? The Main Library offers designated quiet floors (B2, B1, 2, 5, 6, 7) as well as group/collaborative study floors (1, 3, 4). Both the Health Professions and Social Work Libraries offer quiet and group study areas as well.

7 Need power? The Main Library offers charging stations for your electronic devices, such as laptops, cell phones, and iPods. Just remember to be courteous when using your devices and keep the volume down! Charging stations are located on the 2nd and 4th Floors of the Main Library.

8 The Hunter College Libraries are staffed with friendly, knowledgeable librarians who are happy to help and can save you loads of time. You can contact a librarian in person, on the phone, via email, or IM:

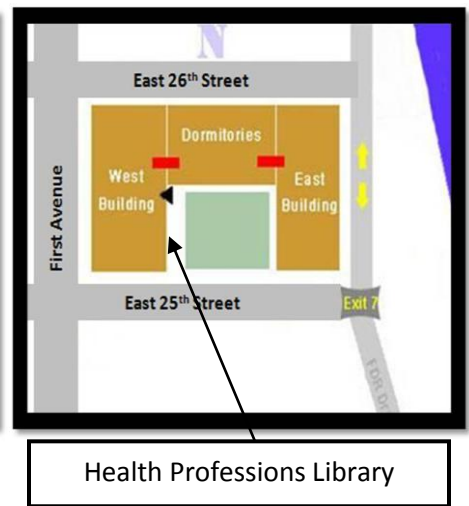
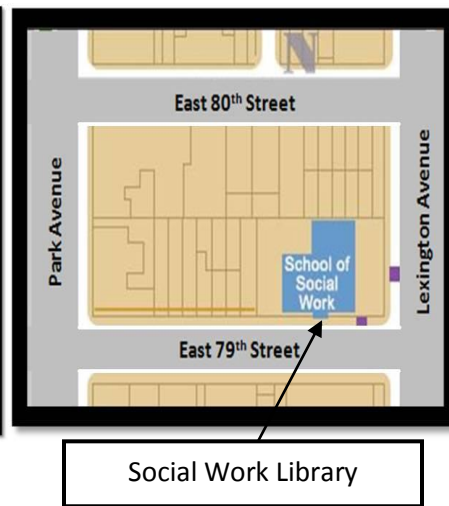
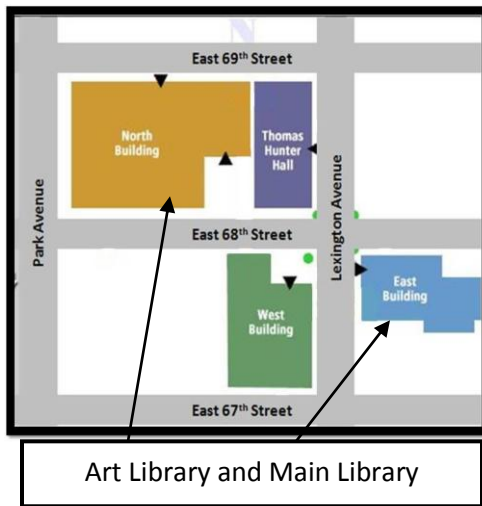

The Zabar Art Library offers a comfortable reading and study space with wireless Internet access and laptops for use within the library. The Library offers Reference services, digital imaging services, color printing, and a non-circulating selection of reference materials, books, art history theses, and current journals. Individual sessions and group workshops on image and text-based database use and presentation software are also offered.

The Social Work Library supports the School of Social Work and is a repository for specialist literature in the field. The Library provides a community space/group study space for the students of the School. Along with a full menu of electronic resources, the Library offers classes about how to access these resources, as well as other programming geared for social work graduate students. Resources at the SSWL include: study rooms; computers with Internet access, Word, SPSS, and Excel and practice software for the Social Work licensing exam; printers; photocopiers; workstation with software for the blind and visually impaired; microform reader; TV/DVD/VCR; wireless Internet access; two circulating laptops available for checkout.

The Hunter College Health Professions Library (HPL) is located on the second floor of the Brookdale campus. HPL supports the undergraduate, graduate and PhD programs in the following disciplines: nursing, public health, environmental and occupational health, nutrition and food sciences, medical lab sciences, physical therapy, and communication sciences. In the library you'll have access to over 26,000 books, 25,000 e-journals, 200 print journals, a computer lab with 30 computers, printers, photocopiers, wireless, laptops, wireless cards, and USB adapters.
