## BOOKS

## ARTICLES

To find journal articles on nutrition topics, start with one of the following recommended databases. They are available from the Hunter College Libraries at [http://library.hunter.cuny.edu/hpl/health\\_db.html](http://library.hunter.cuny.edu/hpl/health_db.html).

- **InfoTrac Health Reference Center**  
Locate full-text articles from a wide variety of publications including practitioner journals, popular magazines and scholarly periodicals.
- **Medline**  
This is the premier database for medical research. All major medical journals are indexed in this source. Some articles may be available in full text. If full text is not available, locate a print copy of the journal using the library catalog CUNY+.
- **CINAHL**  
This nursing database indexes an impressive collection of nutrition articles. Some articles may be available in full text. If full text is not available, locate a print copy of the journal using the library catalog CUNY+.
- **Academic Search Premier**  
Academic Search Premier covers a wide variety of disciplines including indexing some of the core medical journals. Full text is available for many articles and it may be an excellent source to find articles that address legal, social and economic aspects of nutrition.
- **ERIC**  
This core education database is a good place to search for articles relating to nutrition education particularly for children.
- **Food Science and Technology Abstracts (FSTA) (Print ed.)**  
Contains abstracts of articles on food sciences, food products, and food processes from 1800+ journals, books, conference proceedings, standards, and patents.
