## History of the N. C. B. B. T.

Eight long years ago, years in which loyalty has never faltered nor courage wavered, basket-ball began at Normal. Many were the obstructions and difficulties in the path, but one by one they were surmounted. Too much cannot be said in praise of Miss Nancy Kirkman, to whose tireless efforts and unflagging zeal the team owes its foundation.

Finally the road was clear and the team was organized. This was in the spring of 1899, but no game was played until the following year. For that season Miss Kirkman was elected captain and soon had a splendid five ready to battle for Normal's honor. Never will there be found better players than were prominent on that team. Kathleen Murphy, Nancy Kirkman and Julia Hawley stand forth among the first of Normal's long list of skillful players. It could not be expected that the team should be completely successful the first year, but so great was the improvement that those by whom they had been defeated were defeated by them before the end of the year.

In June of 'or the whole team, with the exception of Miss Kirkman, graduated. She was re-elected and soon had a new five ready. Gussie Schroeder and Lucy Wellwood made themselves famous by their wonderful playing. This year's team went through the year without a defeat, covering themselves and their

college with glory.

When Miss Kirkman graduated she left a well-trained five, one of the strongest teams Normal has ever had. The names of Ethel Mahoney, Laura Klotz, Anna Greene and their brilliant captain, Lucy Wellwood, will long be remembered. '03 suffered but one defeat, which was wiped out completely by a glorious victory in the return game. The season closed with a long list of victories, of which Normal may well be proud.

The next year opened with Miss Jeannette Engel in command, supported by Sadie Bleistift, Mary Meltzer and Eleanor McLaughlin. Although defeated by Rosemary Hall and by Erasmus, victory overweighed defeat, and the record of

'04 was an excellent one.

After an exciting election in the spring of 1904, Miss Madeleine Lee was chosen captain. There was at the same time a new office created for the team and Miss Regina Gannon was elected manager to fill a long-felt want. After a period of anxious suspense on the part of candidates for the 'varsity, Miss Rosenheim and Miss Lee, as forwards, Miss Gannon as center, Miss Brady and Miss Lane, as guards, obtained the much-coveted positions. Every girl did the duty required of her, worked for the glory of her college and team and their playing was of the best. All the credit for the year belongs to Miss Lee. When she assumed the captaincy she found chaos; the team unorganized and untrained; nothing but the raw material, so to speak. Soon the 'varsity was formed, and Normal has never seen a better. There were several defeats during the year, but they were owing not to poor playing, but to disadvantages under which the team played. The defeat by Flushing was atoned for by two victories; the defeat by Hoboken High seemed impossible in the light of the second game with a score of 19-7 in favor of Normal; the defeat at the hands of New York Training School faded into insignificance on account of victory in the second game. In spite of these mishaps the year was a most successful one, but the year which followed was the "red-letter" one in the history of the N. C. B. B. T.

Miss Lee was again captain, with Miss Marie Brady as her able manager. These two, with Miss Lane, were now beginning their second year on the 'varsity. Miss Christie and Miss Hotchkiss were placed on the first team as forward and guard respectively, and Miss Lane became center, and each player seemed peculiarly fitted for her own place. Game after game was played and the lavendar and white came out triumphant in one and all. The game which was to close the season came all too soon and so far not one defeat. But oh! how very close we came to it in the Eastern District game. In the last seven seconds the game was won and the season of 1905-1906 closed with victory triumphant throughout. All hail to 'oo and may Normal have many more such seasons in

In the spring of 1906 Miss Lee was for the third time elected captain, showing the esteem in which our "Buddie" was held. She resigned from her position (Continued on page 11)
