## A NEW HONOR FOR HUNTER'S PRESIDENT

President Shuster will leave for France in the middle of November to attend the UNESCO meeting, at which he will represent the United States as an alternate. This distinction is announced in an impressive and exquisite scroll, reading as follows:

"Harry S. Truman, President of the United States of America. To all who shall see these presents, Greeting.

"Know Ye, that, reposing trust and confidence in the Integrity and Ability of George N. Shuster, of New York, I do appoint him an Alternate Representative of the United States to the First Session of the General Conference of the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization to be held in Paris, November 1946, and do authorize and empower him to execute and fulfil the duties of this commission according to law, with all the powers, privileges, and emoluments thereunto of right appertaining during the pleasure of the President of the United States for the time being, and until the end of the next session of the United States Senate, and no longer.

"In testimony whereof I have caused these letters to be made Patent and the Seal of the United States to be thereunto affixed.

"Done at the City of Washington this sixteenth Day of October, in the Year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and seventy-first."

The scroll bears the seal of the United States and the signatures of President Harry S. Truman and Acting Secretary of State Dean Acheson.

The Department of State has announced a long-range policy for the reeducation of the German people, which, at the Department's behest, had been prepared by a Committee of seven. The members of this committee were Edmund E. Day, President of Cornell University; Frank P. Graham, President of the University of North Carolina; Eduard C. Lindeman, of the New York School of Social Work; Martin McGuire, Dean of the Graduate School of the Catholic University of America; Reinhold Niebuhr, Professor of Theology at the Union Theological Seminary; John Milton Potter, President of Hobart College; and George N. Shuster, President of Hunter College.
