

# New Chancellor



The recently appointed Chancellor of the City University, Albert H. Bowker, combines the talents of a distinguished educator, an outstanding statistician and mathematician and an able executive. Dr. Bowker came to the City University from Stanford University, with which he was associated for sixteen years.

A graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Dr. Bowker received his Ph.D. from Columbia University. He joined the faculty of Stanford in 1947 as Assistant Professor of Mathematical Statistics. He served as Executive Head of the Department of Statistics from 1948 to 1959, Associate Professor of Statistics from 1950 to 1953 and Professor of Mathematics and Statistics from 1953 to 1963. In 1949, Dr. Bowker acted as Consultant to the Statistical Engineering Section of the National Bureau of Standards and in 1951 became Director of Applied Mathematics and Statistics Laboratories at Stanford. In 1958, Dr. Bowker was named Dean of the Graduate Division of Stanford and served in that capacity until he came to New York.

Dr. Bowker is currently President of the American Statistical Society and a member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, the Biometric Society and the American Society of Quality Control. He has served as Chairman of the Fellowship Committee of the Association of Graduate Schools in the Association of American Universities and Chairman of the Membership Committee of the Council of Graduate Schools in the United States.

Dr. Bowker is co-author of *Sampling Inspection By Variables*, *Handbook of Industrial Statistics* and *Engineering Statistics*. His articles have appeared in the *Annals of Mathematical Statistics*, the *Journal of Business of the University of Chicago* and *Journal of the American Statistical Association*, and he has contributed chapters to *Techniques of Statistical Analysis* and *Studies in Item Analysis and Prediction*.

# New Dean



Glen Theodore Nygreen is the newly appointed Dean of Students on the Bronx Campus and is also Professor of Sociology. He has come to Hunter from Kent State University, Kent, Ohio.

Dean Nygreen received his Bachelor of Science degree and his Ph.D. at the University of Washington. From 1941 to 1954, he served at the University of Washington as Counselor for Men to the Executive Officer for Student Affairs. He went to Kent State University in 1954 as Dean of Men and in 1958 was named Dean of Students and Associate Professor of Sociology.

Dean Nygreen is currently serving as vice-president of the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators. He is a member of the Executive Council of the American College Personnel Association and is chairman of the Executive Committee of the National Student Committee of the YMCA.

Dean Nygreen's son, a freshman at Hunter, is one of the Thomas Hunter Scholars who are chosen, on the basis of their superior records, to take part in special programs of enrichment.
