## WAR BONDS

The Seventh War Loan Drive is on, and all bonds sold since April 1st by Hunter College students, staff, and alumnae will be counted in the Drive.

Heretofore we have always exceeded our goal, and we sincerely hope to repeat the achievement this time. Professor Samuel Patterson, Chairman of War Activities for Hunter College, and the writer, Chairman of War Bond Sales for the Alumnae, have set \$375,000 as the goal, to be used for the purchase of a giant 4-engine Douglas C54, a trans-Atlantic Mercy Plane, to carry the severely wounded from bases in England or France to the United States. This is the greatest humanitarian task we of the Alumnae and the College have yet undertaken. There are so many of our boys over there, gravely injured from the many bloody battles they have taken part in, waiting to be transported, to be treated in our modernly equipped hospitals in this blessed land of ours. Aren't you eager to get as many as you can over? We all know that there are lots of boys over there who are war-weary, tired, homesick, and very impatient to get back to their loved ones, but they won't quit their job until the war is won and over; and it is *their* hope that *we* on the Home Front won't quit our jobs either. It means *buy more War Bonds*.

Please persuade the male members of your family to purchase or help sell bonds for our Alumnae. If for some reason it isn't convenient to make purchases *directly* through your Chairman, please see to it that credit is given to the Alumnae. The only requisite is to have the bank (or other agency where bonds are purchased) stamp the date, name of purchaser, and address on a slip of paper on the application bond form; and then you can mail this to the Chairman.

A word in reference to the Blue Star Brigade. We had 15 members of our Alumnae who received Commissions (from 2nd Lieutenant through Brigadier General) and citations and pins for their excellent salesmanship in the Sixth War Loan Drive. Why don't more of you enter and join the Blue Star Brigade in this Seventh War Loan Drive? If interested, please notify your Chairman; and she will forward all the necessary information.

Here's hoping we shall all work together and sell not \$375,000 worth of Bonds but \$750,000 so as to purchase not one Douglas C54 but two.

Please bear this in mind, the *bonds* you purchase are only a *loan* to your *government*, the *safest* and *best government* in the world.
