BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Dr. Avodah K. Offit's legacy as an innovator in understanding the psychological basis of human sexuality is evident in her career as a psychiatrist, psychotherapist, and author. She was born on November 18, 1931, in New York, New York. After graduating from Hunter High School in 1948 and Hunter College in 1952, she married Sidney Offit and raised two sons. In 1967, she received her medical degree from New York University Medical School and completed her internship at Lenox Hill Hospital. After completing a residency at Payne Whitney Psychiatric Clinic of New York Hospital, she joined its staff, eventually becoming the Associate Director of the Sexual Treatment Program. She was an assistant professor of psychiatry at Cornell University Medical College and rose to the level of Director at the Sexual Therapy Center of Lenox Hill Hospital. In 1971, she also began a private psychiatric practice. In addition, she was a psychiatric consultant for the New York Association for the Blind.

Dr. Offit was a prolific writer. She published three books, *The Sexual Self* (1977), *Night Thoughts: Reflections of a Sex Therapist* (1981), and *Virtual Love* (1994), a novel. *The Sexual Self* has been translated into three languages, selected by the Literary Guild and *Psychology Today* Book Club, and reviewed with acclaim by *Psychology Today* and *The New York Times Book Review. Night Thoughts*, also a Literary Guild selection, received accolades from the *Los Angeles Times, The New Republic*, and *Publisher's Weekly*, among others. *Virtual Love* was one of the first novels to explore the effects of the internet on life and love. In addition to these books, Dr. Offit wrote a column for *Glamour Magazine*, "Your Sexual Self" (1982-1983), and numerous articles in *Vogue, Harper's Bazaar, Self*, and many others. In addition, she authored book reviews, in such publications as *The New York Times* and *Los Angeles Times*, and she was the subject of many interviews, some about her books and others about her expertise. Furthermore, her writing on sexual dysfunction appeared in medical journals such as *Medical Aspects of Human Sexuality, Archives of Sexual Behavior*, and *Psychiatry 1982 Annual Review*.

As an expert in the field of sexuality, Dr. Offit appeared on various television news programs and talk shows such as the *The Phil Donahue Show*, *Good Morning America*, and *Charlie Rose*. She also delivered numerous lectures at Harvard University, Columbia University, and Albert Einstein College, to name a few.

Dr. Offit's papers contain a wealth of information for students, researchers, and professors in the fields of psychiatry and sex therapy.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection mostly consists of paper documents and books that chronicle Avodah K. Offit's career as a psychiatrist specializing in sexuality. The majority of the paper documents are copies of publications (series 4), either magazine and journal articles; book reviews written by Offit; reviews of Offit's books; citations to Offit and her work; and interviews with Offit. Many of these publications are photocopies. There are a few copies of her books (various editions and languages) plus a few books written by her husband, Sidney Offit. All books are located in Special Collections (SC). The bulk of the collection covers 1970s-early 2000s. Additionally, there is some material on her personal life (series 1), including medical certificates, articles and manuscripts by family members, family photographs, and a curriculum vita. There are a few items pertaining to her career (series 2), such as awards and honors received, lectures delivered, symposia attended, and letterhead utilized. Series 3 consists of a limited number of correspondence, mostly with publishers, interviewers, and colleagues. Finally, series 5 contains publicity for Offit's books, lectures, and magazine column.

The collection is arranged into five series: [1] Personal and Biographical; [2] Career; [3] Correspondence; [4] Writing; and [5] Publicity.

Scope and Content Note

This series mostly contains biographical material about Avodah K. Offit; subseries one focuses on her education, from high school through medical school. Subseries two consists of various items related to her family, such as articles and books written by her husband and son, a wedding announcement for her son, and correspondence with her mother, among others. Subseries three consists of a few photographs of Offit, mostly from the 1950s-1970s, and one photograph of her with family members. Subseries four includes a medical certificate and copy of her curriculum vitae. Subseries five includes items related to her memorial service, such as the program, guest book, and obituary, and a few other miscellaneous items.

SERIES II – CAREER, 1973-2015

Scope and Content Note

This series focuses on Offit's career as a psychiatrist. Subseries one includes awards and honors received and created, such as inclusion in the Phi Beta Kappa Association and the establishment of the Avodah K. Offit Award for Excellence in Writing at Hunter College High School. Subseries two covers lectures given by Offit, including a course taught at the Advanced Institute for Analytic Psychotherapy, and symposia in which she participated, such as the Program for Women's Sexuality. Subseries three consists of a newsletter and lecture series advertisement from Lenox Hill Hospital, where she was on staff. Subseries four includes a piece of blank letterhead, presumably used in her private practice.

It also includes citations to Offit's work, quotes, and interviews in other publications; some of these citations refer to her publications while others quote her directly as an expert on psychiatry and sex therapy. In addition, there are some unpublished works of fiction, a manuscript for a memoir, and a copy of *Echo* (Hunter College's student literary magazine) with a story and illustrations by Offit. Finally, there are reviews of her work from various sources.
