

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Humanity and commitment are strong threads that run through the life of Harold Lewis. A giant in his profession, the seeds of his dedication to service and social justice were planted long before embarking on a career in social work.

Born Harold Losikoff on July 15, 1920, he spent his formative and teen years in a diverse working class neighborhood in East New York, Brooklyn. He attended Thomas Jefferson High School where he met his wife-to-be, Celia, through their joint activity in the American Student Union – one of the first national student peace organizations. The Spanish Civil War was raging. As educational director of the ASU, Harold joined with other students to support the Loyalist government. After high school he attended Brooklyn College where he studied economics and statistics.

He married at the age of twenty-one. At that time, the United States entered World War II and rather than waiting to be drafted, he enlisted so that he could participate in the fight against fascism. In 1944, he was sent to the CBI Theatre in India. His exposure to victims of famine and widespread poverty led him to rethink his earlier vocational choices and to consider a career that would allow him to contribute to the amelioration of social need. With the advent of the G.I. Bill providing support for veterans to pursue college and professional degrees, Lewis began corresponding with schools of social work in the United States. Upon his discharge from the army, he entered the University of Pittsburgh, a unique program that permitted students to major in two methods of practice. Lewis chose research as his area of concentration.

He rose quickly in the ranks of his newly-chosen profession. Following graduation from the University of Pittsburgh, he moved to Omaha where he was Research Director of United Community Services. In 1951, he was offered a position as Assistant Professor at the University of Connecticut School of Social Work. This was the McCarthy era – a dangerous time for a social activist. Lewis was forced to resign from his position at the University in 1954, despite Dean Harleigh Trecker's efforts to retain him.

After moving to Providence with his wife and two children to assume a position as Research Secretary for the Council of Community Services, Lewis was soon recruited (1956) by the University of Pennsylvania School of Social Work to help advance their research program. He earned his doctorate there in 1959 while teaching and serving as chairman of the research department. In 1961 he was appointed chairman of the doctoral program and remained on the faculty until 1969. In the summers he worked as unit director at Camp Woodland, one of the earliest interracial, nonsectarian children's camps.

In addition to contributing to school curricula and professional standards, Lewis's time at the University of Pennsylvania was marked by his outspokenness against the war in Vietnam and its impact on domestic social spending. His was an early voice among those who urged their colleagues to stand with the students who were rallying on college campuses around the country. Lewis was recruited by Hunter College to serve as Dean of the School of Social Work in 1969. In the same year, he was recruited by the Center for the Advanced Study of Behavioral and Social Sciences in Palo Alto, California – the first person in the field of social work to receive this honor. His time at the Center afforded him the opportunity to meet and discuss his ideas with people in different disciplines – notably John Rawls, the philosopher and ethicist. The work Lewis produced during his stay was later published as a book entitled, *The Intellectual Base of Social Work Practice: Tools for Thought in a Helping Profession*.

In 1970, he assumed the Deanship at Hunter SSW. Lewis welcomed this opportunity to develop his ideas in a public education setting. One of his early accomplishments was the initiation of the first doctoral program in the CUNY system. He instituted a curriculum using a value-based rubric as its organizing principle. In this way he was able to actualize his philosophy of professional education designed to respond to common human needs. He was concerned about the lack of opportunity available to many human service workers to pursue a master's degree; this led him to develop the first work-study program for experienced bachelor-level work, a model that was later adopted by schools around the country. As a result of his leadership, the school became nationally ranked among the top ten nationwide.

Lewis retired from his position at Hunter in 1990. He led an active retirement, traveling, taking art courses, and keeping up with professional obligations. In the last few years of his life, he was afflicted with Parkinson's disease. He remained at home where he died on July 18, 2003. In keeping with his philosophy of altruism, he had arranged to be an anatomical donor.

Lewis's intellectual accomplishments are portrayed in material you will find in the archives. Perhaps not as readily apparent in that material are examples of the trademark humor and genuine modesty that endeared him to his colleagues. One could always count on a pun or cogent remark in any situation – never, however, taking away from the import of his message.

Beyond his professional work, Lewis maintained many interests throughout his life. An avid appreciator of the arts, Lewis himself created drawings, painting and enamel works. He was a cyclist and a folk dancer and enjoyed walking to work each day on a familiar path through Central Park. He shared himself generously and openly with friends and family. The strength and tenacity of his convictions helped to shape the social work profession during his lifetime and for future generations.

MEMORIAL TRIBUTE

The following tributes were presented at the Harold Lewis Memorial Celebration on September 3, 2003, at the Hunter College School of Social Work.

President Jacqueline Grennan Wexler, Hunter College, 1970 - 1979:

Hal Lewis – A Man of Integrity:

Hal and I came to Hunter College together in 1970. For the next ten years, we shared growing dedication to Hunter and our mutual respect for one another.

As an academic, Hal integrated hands-on learning with traditional academic theories.

As a professor-mentor, he graced the lives of his students intellectually and spiritually and lives on in them – so beautifully revealed moments ago in the moving words of Mukunda Rao.

As a dean, he led the School of Social Work in developing strong, professional programs for practicing professionals.

As a colleague in the administration and in the faculty, he shared his creative insights and listened with respect and curiosity as they shared their insights with him.

But he also shared his warmth and sense of humor professionally and personally with all of us here in this hall today and with countless others.

As a professional, as a friend, and as a husband and father, Hal was always himself – achieving his great potential but never parading his achievements.

We celebrate the wholesomeness of his life today – with gratitude and affection for this simple, complex, and elegant man of integrity.

MEMORIAL TRIBUTE

Professor Charles Guzzetta, Hunter College School of Social Work

Hal was brilliant, creative and intense. He was very funny and fun-loving. The picture of him on stage is perfect: he has just told a joke and he is watching to see if you got it. (You didn't.)

He told lots of jokes and they had two characteristics: first, they were always clean; and second, they were sometimes funny. He was at best with puns. It's amazing that over the years we heard hundreds of Hal's puns but can't remember one of them. That's because they were always spontaneous, never rehearsed. They reflected his great intellect as well as his great wit.


He also used humor to praise or criticize. Hal had trouble praising or criticizing people directly, so he did it with humor. One thing we never agreed on was student evaluation of faculty. Hal thought it was useful. We debated endlessly. One time in his office, he shoved some papers across my desk saying, "Here are the student evaluations of your class. They're high and some students have petitioned to have another class with you." Pause. "So," he went on, triumphantly, "now what do you think of student evaluations?" I said that it felt good to get high ratings, but they were just as meaningless as low ones. He chuckled and shoved some more papers over, saying, "That's good, because here's another class evaluation. Some of those students said that if they're assigned to another course with you, they'll transfer to Adelphi." That was a Hal "zinger" and he did it all the time. He loved to "zing" you. He was good at it, but he took as good as he gave.

He never hid behind his office, but seemed to enjoy a good zing in which he was the victim. It was the kind of intellectual exchange he relished and always encouraged. He never used humor meanly, to demean or humiliate; only to amuse or instruct.

He was strong, but a caring, gentle man. Perhaps the best description of him was written 400 years ago. Shakespeare purists will have to forgive me for changing the last word – slightly. I think Hal would have approved. It goes like this:

His life was gentle and the elements so mix'd in him That Nature might stand up and say to all the world:

"This was a mensch."

MEMORIAL TRIBUTE

Professor Rose Dobrof, Brookdale Center on Aging, Hunter College

Ceil, Amy, Beth, and all of Hal's family, friends, and colleagues: I shall speak for myself, of course, but please permit me to begin with a message from Donna E. Shalala, who was one of Hal's two presidents during his tenure at Hunter. Classes start today at the University of Miami, and Donna, president and professor and football cheerleader, is teaching her first class this afternoon. She asked, however that I tell you that she is with us in spirit: like President Wexler, Donna admired and loved Hal. She wrote the forward to the wonderful book, of Hal's essays that Michael Reisch edited, and she ended with these words... "Most of all, I want to salute my friend and colleague, Harold Lewis, whose life and intellectual contributions were humane, ethical, and brilliant." Those words sum up, but do not, cannot express, the respect and affection Donna had for Hal.

Hal and Ceil and Alfred and I became friends in September of 1946, when Hal and I were first year students at the University of Pittsburgh School of Social Work. Ours was the first post-war class at Pitt, and included many, like Hal and Alfred, whose education was interrupted or delayed by the war. These were golden years at the University of Pittsburgh School of Social Work: A faculty of stellar researchers, educators, social activists, and successful practitioners, including Marion Hathway, who was Hal's mentor and friend. It was she who called Hal in one day to suggest that he learn to talk a little slower: "Not everyone,"

Professor Hathway told Hal, "talks as fast as you do, and much less do they think as fast and in so complex a fashion as you." I was Professor Hathway's teaching assistant during Hal's and my second year, and I can attest at first hand to her regard for him. I should also note that Professor Hathway was chairperson of the Progressive Party of Pennsylvania, and led the local struggle for the election of Henry Wallace in 1948!

And the classes of '47 and '48: they brought with them a wealth of pre-professional social work experience; they were former agency executives and social work supervisors among them, and the veterans brought also the lessons learned from their wartime service. Many of our class went on to brilliant careers as Deans of Schools of Social Work; as public officials, as agency executives. It was a time of social ferment; evidence of the ferment was the fact that a city-wide strike in Pittsburgh closed down the elevators in the Cathedral of Learning. Social work classes were, if memory serves, on the 21st and 34th floors...so we began our graduate education in nearby churches and social agencies. And these were good times, a time of optimism about the post-war future.

And among this brilliant array of students, Hal was the shinning star. One student was a rock-ribbed political liberal and a faith-centered Protestant, and he joined the students, a group to which, I, of course, belonged, who learned from and became friends with Hal. During a mid-term conference during our first year, the student's faculty advisor told him that she was puzzled by one thing. It seemed that ALL of his friends in the school were Jewish – why was that, given his own religious background? After the conference, the student reported to us that he was astonished by the question, not because it was so intrusive and inappropriate, but because the answer was so obvious. "If you were in my class,

wouldn't you want to be friends with the smartest, best students," and he named a few, and then he said, "and think of Hal Lewis! Listening to him is an education in itself."

And so it was for many of us. We learned from Hal, in class, in the Tuck Shop, where we all ate, whenever we were with him. And along with his being the brightest of the bright, he was also one of the kindest, most giving of the class. He befriended a student from India – not just because he had spent so much time in India during his army career and understood the difficulties the student was facing, but because he was kind and generous and giving of himself. And that student went on to become dean of one of the great schools of social work of India, and he never forgot Hal's kindness to him. Alfred and I visited with him when we were in India in the early 1980's, and he spoke of his gratitude and respect for Hal.

Hal also gave me wise counsel at a crisis time in my then young life, and I was only one of many who benefited from his concern and advice.

This was Hal – Jewish to the core, but an orthodox atheist. Rabbi Michael Paley talks of his co-religionist in the fashion: "Jews cannot believe in more than one God. Less, maybe; but more, never." Hal didn't believe in God and the afterlife, but if it turns out that he was wrong, then he is in heaven discussing distributive justice with John Rawls!

That was Hal, a believer in humanity, who loved people, a community organizer, social activist, the most brilliant theoretician of our profession, administrator, educator, teacher, colleague – all those good things...and a sensitive, caring, stalwart friend. I think of Hal, and I think of the words of the scientist I.I. Rabi "Wisdom is the application of knowledge to the benefit of mankind." Hal was wise, and surely all that he did has benefited our society and all of us. He will not be forgotten, and the good that he did will endure.

MEMORIAL TRIBUTE

Remarks of Nikki and Jennifer Reisch

Trying to remember and celebrate and describe our feelings for our Granpa Hal in a few words is very difficult, maybe impossible. We feel so many things about our Granpa as a person, as the father of our mom, aunt, as the life-long partner of our Grandma. And we, like you, mourn his passing with all our hearts. We will love and remember him always.

Our Granpa Hal was a man of vibrant intellect and gentle spirit, full of wit, a creator of puns and a man of enormous patience, warmth, and openness, curiosity and abundant creativity.

His creativity, compassion and sense of humor were not only reflected in the broad strokes of his life's work and the relationship he built with our Grandma, but in the details, in the illustrated letters he wrote to us and the elaborate tales of "ooglie" the dragon he wove for us, the sheepish grin he always wore after puns at the dinner table, and his uncanny ability to bring "dialectics" into almost any conversation.

Our grandfather inspired and continues to inspire us in many ways – from his love of travel and people from all walks of life, to his enduring commitment to justice, his optimism about humanity, his playful humor, and his ability to listen to and engage almost anyone.

Granpa Hal wrote many beautiful letters to our Granma from India, where the experiences he haD inspired his lifelong commitment to justice and peace and helped shape his passion for people, arts and learning.

In loving memory of our Granpa Hal, we are going to read a poem by one of his favorite writers, from the same country – India–Rabindranath Tagore.

The Day's End

When the flute becomes silent And the light goes out, When the curtain comes down over life's play, May there be no gathering of men To mourn the poet. May the chairman remain at home playing cards And not call his memorial meeting!

I know the flowers will remember me. Wherever the flutes play round me Celebrating the season's festivals – In spring, autumn and the rains – There my seat will be decorated lovingly In cool, refreshing green, And my silence filled with the songs of birds. I know the message will echo through the forest: "To their melodies I strung together the poet's words." It will resound in the patter of rain, In the thunder of the clouds, In the hues of early dawn.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Professor Harold Lewis was the former Dean of the School of Social Work of Hunter College from 1970 to 1990. During these years Professor Lewis worked tirelessly to elevate the School of Social Work by recruiting outstanding educators and by making sure that students were prepared to meet the challenges of a complex and ever evolving urban society as prospective social workers.

The Harold Lewis Papers document the life and work of an extraordinary individual who as an administrator, colleague, educator, and scholar drew the admiration and respect of professionals across multiple academic disciplines. Professor Lewis' addresses, essays, articles, books, and reviews illuminate his prowess as a scholar and writer. They revealed his inquisitive and incessant desire to explore new topics and, on occasion, to reassess established theories and norms. Professor Lewis' writings primarily focused on issues related to practice and policy, values and ethics, and education within the social work discipline.(1) Some of Professor Lewis' works that are considered classics in the field of Social Work include *Management in the Non-Profit Social Service Organization* (1975), *Social Work and the Common Good* (1977), *Education Preparation for Practice* (1978), *The Battered Helper* (1979), *The Continuum: Issues in Social Work Education*(1983), *The Whistle Blower and the Whistle-Blowing Profession* (1984), *Teaching Ethics through Ethical Teaching* (1986), and *Values and Ethics in Agency Practice for Caring and Just Service* (1988).

The Harold Lewis Papers also provide a glimpse of his association with The Center For Psycho-Social Issues in the Nuclear Age, the Center for Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences, the Council on Social Work Education, and the National Association of Social Workers. Author Michael Reisch states that Lewis "was a scholar-activist who promoted the causes of peace, social justice, and human dignity, and mentored dozens of younger social work students and educators to follow a similar path."(2) The collection also reveals Professor Lewis' active collaboration as editor/writer with the *Administration in Social Work*, the *Journal of Progressive Human Services*, the *Journal of Social Service Research and Social Casework: the Journal of Contemporary Social Work*.

The Harold Lewis Papers should be of interest to administrators, faculty, students, and practitioners in the field of Social Work. Researchers may want to know how the Hunter College School of Social Work "...became a center of excellence in the College, the profession, New York City, the nation, and the international community under Lewis' helm."(3) Faculty and students may find Lewis' writings to be engaging and provocative enough to stimulate a reassessment of the current state of affairs of the social work profession. Finally, social work practitioners who examine these papers may experience a renewed sense of vigor and commitment in assisting the less fortunate in our society.

SERIES DESRIPTION

Series I – Personal and Biographical Information

Lewis' achievements and contributions in the field of social work are acknowledged by the variety of awards, certificates, diplomas, and tributes that were bestowed upon him during his illustrious career. Lewis's admiration, respect, and love of family, colleagues, and friends are vividly displayed through an array of candid photographs. Finally, Lewis' artistic talent is showcased by a representative sample of color prints and by black and white sketches. The files are arranged alphabetically.

Series II – Correspondence

Subseries 2.1 - 1961-1997 Subseries 2.2 - A-Z

Subseries 2.1 consists of incoming and outgoing letters from academic institutions, organizations, professors, students, and publishers. The bulk of the letters came from individuals who requested advice, information, letters of recommendation, and/or inquired about the availability of positions at the Hunter College School of Social Work. Other letters were from publishers who solicited reviews of forthcoming publications. The letters are arranged chronologically. Subseries 2.2 consist of letters that were maintained by Lewis in alphabetical sequence. The letters are kept in their original filing order.

Subseries 3.1 consists of Lewis' transcript from the University of Pittsburgh School of Social Work plus several awards that he received from the school's alumni association. Subseries 3.2 consists of course syllabi, subject bibliographies, student papers, and reports. Also included are two works that Lewis produced when he was enrolled at the University of Pennsylvania School of Social Work from 1956 to 1959. The first is his thesis titled *Learning To Teach Research in a Functional School of Social Work* which he wrote in partial fulfillment for an Advanced Curriculum Certificate in 1957. The second is Lewis' Ph. D dissertation titled *The Researcher as Helper in Community Planning Research* which he wrote in 1959. Subseries 3.3 consists of files that are associated with Lewis' tenure as Dean of the Hunter College School of Social Work for 1970, and "A Partnership in Caring: A Blue-print for the Hunter College School of Social Work's Development until the Year 2000." The files are arranged alphabetically.

Series IV - Writings

Subseries 4.1 consists of addresses, essays, and papers that Lewis presented at various conferences, schools, and organizations between 1953 and 1990. The presentations are arranged chronologically. Subseries 4.2 consists of articles, book chapters, and reports that were published by Lewis between 1965 and 1991. The writings are arranged chronologically. Subseries 4.3 contains book reviews published by Lewis between 1973 and 1983. Key works that were reviewed include: *A Theory of Justice* by John Rawls; *The Paradox of Helping* by Martin Bloom; *Ethical Decisions for Social Work Practice* by Frank Lowenberg; *The Development of Professional Self: Teaching and Learning in Professional Help Processes, Selected Writings, 1930-1968*, by Virginia P. Robinson; and *The Demilitarized Society* by Seymour Melman. The book reviews are arranged chronologically. Subseries 4.4 contains original manuscripts of articles, books, and papers that were presented and/or published by Lewis between 1972 and 1990. In addition, there are several undated and untitled typescripts. The dated manuscripts are arranged chronologically while the undated works are arranged by title. Subseries 4.5 consists of unidentified annotations that seem to be preliminary notes for articles, class lectures, and papers written by Lewis.

Series V – Organizations

Series V underscores Lewis' association and involvement with The Center For Psychosocial Issues in the Nuclear Age, the Center For Advanced Study in the Behavioral Sciences, the Council on Social Work Education, and the National Association of Social Workers. This series also underlines Lewis' affiliation with the following journals: *Administration in Social Work*, the *Journal of Progressive Human Services*, the *Journal of Social Service Research*, and *Social Casework*: *The Journal of Contemporary Social Work*. The files are arranged alphabetically by the name of the organization or by title of the journal.

Series VI – Miscellaneous Materials

This series includes an assortment of files on topics ranging from analogy, ethics, and bioethics, to teaching methodologies, and health and welfare. These files are arranged alphabetically by subject.

Series VII – Subject File

Both subseries are arranged alphabetically by surname. Subseries 7.3 and 7.4 consist of journals, reports, and studies that are arranged alphabetically by publication title. Subseries 7.5 consists of manuals and handbooks, programs and brochures from conferences, symposiums, and workshops, and general works. Subseries 7.6 consists of general works. Subseries 7.7 consists of copies of Ph. D dissertations circa 1960's through the late 1980's. The dissertations are arranged alphabetically by surname.


